- 2 \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*
- 3 MS. LILLY EFIRD, having been first duly sworn by the
- 4 Clerk, testified on DIRECT EXAMINATION by MS. ALLEN:
- Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) Good afternoon, Ms. Efird. Would you
- state your full name for the Court, please.
- 7 A. Lilly Peralta Efird.
- 8 Q. Are you Robert Peralta's sister?
- 9 A. Yes.
- 10 Q. Okay. And --
- THE COURT: Ms. Efird, could you pull up a
- 12 little closer to that microphone. Thank you.
- 13 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) Ms. Efird, would you tell us what in the
- last ten years you have been convicted of that is a Class
- 15 Two misdemeanor or greater?
- 16 A. The only charges I've had in the last ten years are DWI
- 17 charges.
- 18 O. Okay. And I believe that back in 1999 in July you gave
- an interview to S.B.I. Agent John Reid who is right here?
- 20 A. Right.
- 21 O. Do you recall that?
- 22 A. Yes.
- 23 Q. Okay. And have you had a chance to look over your
- 24 statement that you gave?
- 25 A. Yes, ma'am.

- I Q. Okay. And I'm going to ask you if you know Scott Allen?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. How do you know him?
- 4 A. Through a friend of mine, Vanessa Smith.
- 5 Q. Okay. And how do you know Ms. Smith?
- 6 A. I've knew Vanessa for a pretty good while. Whenever I
- first met her she was pregnant with her son, and I worked
- 8 with her ex-husband in screen printing. I was his
- 9 supervisor. And I met them through other friends, and I
- knew of her afterwards, and sometime, I guess '98 to '99
- I met Scott through Vanessa. For a time lapse in between
- that I didn't even see them, and then later on I got back
- up with Vanessa, and then Scott come back into the
- 14 picture.
- 15 Q. Okay. What was the relationship between Scott and
- Vanessa, the best you could tell?
- 17 A. They were boyfriend and girlfriend at that time.
- 18 Q. Okay. And do you remember being in court somewhere on or
- about July 12<sup>th</sup>, 1999 and getting some messages on your
- 20 pager?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Okay. Could you tell who was paging you?
- 23 A. Actually at the time I had took a lunch break, and when 1
- went out to the store I had noticed I had pages on there.
- 25 At first I didn't know who it was. I called home and

- found out that she was at my home.
- 2 Q. And when you say she, who do you mean?
- 3 A. Vanessa.
- 4 Q. Okay. She was at your house?
- 5 A. Right.
- 6 Q. And where was your house at that time?
- 7 A. On Old Mill Road, Route One, Stanfield, North Carolina.
- 8 Q. Okay. Is that in Stanly County?
- 9 A. Yes.
- 10 O. Is it near Albemarle?
- 11 A. Probably about fifteen minutes away from the city limits.
- 12 Q. Okay. And Vanessa was at your house. Was that a
- surprise to you?
- 14 A. At the time, yes.
- 15 Q. Okay. Now at some point you went home that day, is that
- 16 right?
- 17 A. Yes. After I got through with court in the early
- 18 afternoon.
- 19 Q. Okay. And was she still there at your house when you got
- 20 home?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. All right. What did y'all talk about?
- 23 A. Well, when I called her on the phone she was real upset,
- and I told her I'd be there just as soon as I could get
- there. When I got there she said she wanted to talk with

## LILLY EFIRD

- me, and she wanted to ride to the store so me and her
- could talk. My children wanted to go, and she said that
- 3 she wanted to talk just directly to me.
- 4 Q. Without your children being around?
- 5 A. Right.
- 6 Q. Okay.
- 7 A. So on the way to the store she discussed to me what had
- 8 happened between her and Scott and the guy that had got
- 9 killed.
- 10 Q. Christopher Gailey?
- 11 A. Yeah, I never knew his last name, I just knew him as
- 12 Chris. I only met him one time.
- 13 Q. Okay. And Ms. Efird, do you recall what she told you
- 14 about what had happened?
- 15 A. She told me that they had walked through the woods, that
- they were carrying a shotgun, that she helped them carry
- it, back and forth, they'd pass it back and forth because
- they walked a long way through the woods. And she said
- 19 that he had pushed her down on the ground and started
- Shooting, and the guy, best I remember she said the guy
  - 21 had shot back, and she was on the ground with her head
  - 22 covered up with her hands.
  - 23 Q. Okay.
  - 24 A. So afterwards he told her to leave, and probably about
  - 25 five or six hours later she came back and picked him up

- I on the side of the road.
- 2 Q. All right. Did she say anything about a cabin out there?
- 3 A. No. She didn't say anything about the cabin, but the
- only reason I know, prior, I had come and picked them up
- before and walked up to the cabin. I don't even know if
- it's the same one, but the picture looked just like the
- one when I had come and picked them up at some time
- 8 before this had come about.
- 9 Q. Okay.
- MS. ALLEN: If I may approach the witness, Your
- Honor?
- THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.
- 13 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) Ms. Efird, I'm showing you State's
- 14 Exhibit Number Forty-Two that has been entered into
- 15 evidence. Does that look familiar to you?
- 16 A. Actually, no.
- 17 Q. That does not look familiar to you?
- 18 A. Maybe. The part that I saw looked like, was like, it was
- white, and maybe the opposite side of the house, but it
- 20 was white. The house was white. It was a small cabin-
- looking place that I had went to to pick them up after
- work one evening.
- 23 Q. Okay. Ms. Efird, now I'm going to show you what I've
- 24 marked as State's Exhibit Forty-One that's been entered
- into evidence. Does that look familiar to you? That was

- I another place.
- 2 A. No.
- 3 Q. Okay. Now at some point you had a picture of that cabin,
- and neither one of those looked familiar to you, is that
- 5 correct?
- 6 A. It was just like an old house way out in the woods.
- 7 Q. Okay.
- 8 A. I had come off a paved road onto a dirt road, and I rode
- 9 until I saw her standing on the side of the road.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. And I pulled my car over and walked with her up to the
- 12 house.
- 13 Q. Okay.
- 14 A. Or an old abandoned house, whatever it was.
- 15 Q. Okay. And was there a point in time when Scott and
- Vanessa stayed with you at your house?
- 17 A. Yes. What, at the time that I'm telling you about when I
- 18 picked her up on the side of the road?
- 19 Q. Yes, ma'am.
- 20 A. We walked up to what I call an old abandoned house,
- cabin, whatever you want to call it.
- 22 Q. Okay.
- 23 A. I met them -- Well, me and Vanessa walked up through the
- woods, and she had carried a bag on the way back. I
- 25 helped Scott carry a bag. Well, he started carrying it

- and then I -- he carried one side and I carried the other
- 2 to my vehicle, put the stuff in the trunk, stopped at the
- 3 Amoco, got gas, and went straight to my house.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. Or my trailer.
- 6 Q. Okay. And while they were staying with you what did you
- 7 find out about Scott Allen?
- 8 A. Well, I had heard before that he had --
- 9 MR. ATKINSON: Objection.
- THE COURT: Ma'am, don't tell us what you heard
- from other people unless it was from --
- 12 A. Well, Vanessa had told me that --
- MR. ATKINSON: Objection.
- 14 THE COURT: That's sustained at this point.
- Members of the jury, if you wouldn't mind, just take a
- 16 little walk back, please.
- 17 (Jury is excused from the courtroom.)
- 18 TIME: 2:09 p.m.
- (The following proceedings were held in open court,
- 20 no jurors being present.)
- THE COURT: Okay. Would you answer that
- 22 question now, please, ma'am.
- 23 A. As far as me actually knowing, I was told that he had
- escaped like a week before he was supposed to get out. I
- personally don't know, don't know the guy, other than

- what little bit he was around me at my trailer, and I had
- met him prior, maybe four, five, six months before then.
- 3 THE COURT: All right.
- 4 A. I really don't even know Scott.
- THE COURT: I see. Well, who told you that?
- 6 A. Vanessa.
- 7 THE COURT: All right. I'm going to let her
- 8 testify to that. You want to talk to her right now about
- anything else that we can do outside the presence of the
- jury, because I've got a burning question here. Ma'am,
- look at all three of these. One's Two, one's Forty-One,
- 12 and one's Forty-Two. Can you tell us if when you were
- asked about a cabin, whether any of those were the cabin?
- 14 A. No.
- 15 THE COURT: Any of those look familiar?
- 16 A. No.
- 17 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. You
- understand I'm not suggesting that any of them should
- 19 look familiar to you. I'm just asking you the question.
- 20 Because I don't know anything.
- 21 A. No, but what I'm looking at now looks, you know.
- THE COURT: Ma'am, look at Forty-Three, does
- that look familiar?
- 24 A. No.
- 25 THE COURT: All right.

- 1 A. This is wooden-colored, and the house I remember seeing
- was like white. It had been painted, I think.
- THE COURT: All right. Thank you. All right.
- Any further questions about conversations, telephone
- 5 calls, anything like that?'
- 6 MS. ALLEN: There is a question about her
- 7 taking Scott somewhere, but that's fine.
- 8 THE COURT: No, that won't be it. The same
- 9 type of questions. Bring the jury back in. Objection
- 10 overruled. I change my ruling.
- (Jury enters the courtroom.)
- 12 TIME: 2:13 p.m.
- 13 (The following proceedings are held in open court in
- the presence of the jury.)
- THE COURT: Thank you. Ask her your question,
- 16 ma'am.
- 17 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) Ms. Efird, what did you find out about
- 18 Scott Allen during the period that he and Vanessa Smith
- 19 were staying with you?
- 20 MR. OLDHAM: Objection to the form.
- 21 A. That he --
- 22 THE COURT: Overruled. You may answer.
- 23 A. Do I answer it?
- 24 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.
- 25 A. I was told that he had escaped the week before he was

- I supposedly able to get out of prison.
- 2 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) And who told you that?
- 3 A. Vanessa. Why he was in or anything like that, I don't
- 4 know.
- 5 Q. And did there come a point in time when they were there
- 6 that Scott asked you to take him somewhere?
- 7 A. Yes, after I had got off of work one afternoon.
- 8 Q. Do you remember where you took him?
- 9 A. I took him to Millingport at the store. It's a BP
- 10 station there, across the street is a motorcycle shop, at
- 11 that time. I guess it still is, I don't know.
- 12 Q. And did you see who he was meeting there?
- 13 A. I did not see the guy at the time, but he told me he was
- 14 supposed to meet someone in a white truck. Across the
- 15 street was a white truck, and I let him off at the store,
- 16 and I left.
- 17 Q. Okay. Did you see the truck itself?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. Okay.
- MS. ALLEN: If I could have State's Exhibit
- 21 Number Fifty-Nine.
- 22 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) Ms. Efird, I'm handing you what I've
- marked as State's Exhibit Number Fifty-Nine. It's been
- 24 entered into evidence. Does that look familiar to you?
- 25 7 Vac

- 1 Q. Is that the truck that you saw there when he went to meet
- 2 somebody?
- 3 A. Yes, it's the same truck.
- 4 Q. Okay. Now, did you see Scott later on that day?
- 5 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 6 Q. And tell us about that.
- 7 A. After I had let Scott out I had went to the store, and on
- 8 the way home I got behind the truck. And they come back
- 9 to my house for a short visit, and that's when I had met
- 10 Chris. They wasn't there very long, and then Chris and
- II Scott left together.
- 12 Q. Okay. So you met Chris for the first time at that point
- in time?
- 14 A. First and only.
- 15 Q. Okay. Thank you. No further questions.
- 16 THE COURT: Any cross?
- MR. ATKINSON: Yes, Your Honor.
- 18 \*
- 19 \*
- 20 CROSS EXAMINATION of MS. LILLY EFIRD by MR. ATKINSON:
- 21 Q. (BY MR. ATKINSON) Ms. Efird, you indicated that on July
- 22 the 12<sup>th</sup> of '99, you were somewhere and that you had some
- 23 calls on your pager, is that correct?
- 24 A. Yes, sir.
- 25 Q. Where did you indicate you were?

- 1 A. At Stanly County Courthouse.
- 2 Q. Okay. And had you -- did you notice anything -- was
- 3 there anything special or particular about those, what
- 4 you noticed on the pager?
- 5 A. Well, when I went to lunch at that time I didn't -- the
- 6 three calls, I didn't really understand that calls, but
- 7 then later I got the number 420 on there which was a code
- 8 that Vanessa would leave for me to be able to call her
- 9 back.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. And I couldn't understand at the time why I was getting
- the calls, the messages, you know, at that point in time,
- because only my children would normally be calling.
- 14 Q. Okay. Were your children not with you at the courthouse?
- 15 A. My  $\operatorname{\mathsf{--}}$  I had two children that were in a case involving a
- 16 situation with a predica -- a certain situation.
- 17 Q. And they were with you there at the courthouse?
- 18 A. The two older ones. My younger one was at school.
- 19 Q. Okay. Did you -- Do you recall making the -- The
- 20 District Attorney asked you about a statement you made to
- officers, Agent Reid of the S.B.I. back in July of 1999.
- 22 Do you recall making that statement? Is that correct?
- 23 A. About my children?
- 24 Q. Well, about the statement that you made to Officer -- to
- 25 Agent Reid back in 1999. Do you remember talking with

- him?
- 2 A. I remember talking to him, yes, sir.
- 3 Q. And making a statement?
- 4 A. Yes, sir.
- 5 Q. And in that statement, do you recall telling him that you
- 6 were at the courthouse and your daughter's ages, nine,
- 7 eleven, and thirteen, were with you there at the
- g courthouse?
- 9 A. I -- I -- I don't know that I mentioned my baby girl, but
- 10 I'm sure the other two were involved because of the case
- 11 that existed on their behalf.
- 12 Q. You indicated, did you not, that you called and talked --
- in response to these pages, you called your home, did you
- 14 not?
- 15 A. Yes, sir.
- 16 O. And who answered the phone?
- 17 A. Vanessa.
- 18 Q. Okay. Now whenever she answered the phone, did you
- notice anything peculiar about her speech?
- 20 A. Yeah, she sounded like she had been taking something.
- 21 Q. Well, describe her speech.
- 22 A. It was just like she was real groggy like.
- 23 Q. Speech slurred?
- 24 A. Yes.
- 25 O. Is that what you indicated in your statement?

- I A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And you indicated, did you not, that Scott Allen
- 3 was not there with her?
- 4 A. Not that I know of. I know for a fact when I got there
- he wasn't there, and I'm pretty sure he wasn't there
- 6 beforehand.
- 7 Q. Okay. Did you subsequently leave and go to your
- 8 residence?
- 9 A. After I left the courthouse.
- 10 Q. Okay. What time would that have been?
- 11 A. Between 4:30 and 5:00, I imagine, because it would have
- 12 been that late evening.
- 13 Q. Well, what time was it, if you recall, when you placed
- the call to your home and she answered the phone?
- 15 A. Around lunch time at their lunch break, between 12:30 and
- 1:00, I would say.
- 17 Q. Okay. And whenever you got there, what did you and --
- 18 what, if anything, did you and Vanessa do after you got
- 19 to your house?
- 20 A. After I got to my house she said she had something to
- 21 talk to me about, so me and her rode to the store across
- the street from West Stanly High School. And my children
- 23 wanted to go, like I had stated earlier, but Vanessa
- 24 asked for them not to go because I had no clue what she
- wanted to tell me. So on the way there she started

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- talking about what had happened.
- 2 Q. Okay. And now after you and she left to go to the store,
- 3 is that correct?
- 4 A. Right.
- 5 Q. And you stated that she started telling you some things?
- 6 A. Right.
- 7 Q. Okay. You indicated, what was it you said, that Scott
- 8 Allen had pushed her?
- 9 A. Said that when they were going through the woods that he
- 10 pushed her to the ground and started shooting Chris.
- 11 Q. And what did you say after that, something about the guy
- 12 firing, shooting back?
- 13 A. That's what was stated to me.
- 14 Q. Okay. In your statement you didn't -- Do you recall
- making any statement like that whenever you gave this to
- 16 Officer Reid?
- 17 A. Do I recall making a statement that that's what I said?
- 18 Q. Did you tell Officer Reid anything about who was firing
- and what was going on there at the scene?
- 20 A. I imagine I did because that's what was told to me.
- 21 Q. Okay. What -- You indicated, did you not, that Vanessa
- 22 said that Scott Allen told her to do what there at the
- 23 scene?
- 24 A. To leave the scene and to come back later to pick him up.
- 25 Q. Okay. And she indicated -- Did she indicate to you

- I that's what she did?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. That she left there immediately, did she not, is that
- 4 what she indicated?
- 5 A. What she told me, that's all I know.
- 6 Q. Okay. And did she tell you that -- did she describe to
- 7 you where she thought Chris had been shot?
- 8 A. She said that he had been shot behind in his legs and his
- 9 back, that's all I know.
- 10 Q. Now, is that what she told you, Ms. Efird?
- 11 A. Yes.
- MR. ATKINSON: May I approach the witness, Your
- Honor?
- THE COURT: Yes, sir.
- 15 Q. (BY MR. ATKINSON) Is this the statement, Ms. Efird, that
- 16 you made to Officer Reid?
- MR. YATES: Objection. If he's going to ask
- her about it he can mark it.
- MR. ATKINSON: Mark it --
- 20 THE COURT: Defendant's exhibit for
- 21 identification purposes Defendant's Exhibit Number Three,
- 22 I think.
- 23 COURT REPORTER: Number Three, yes , sir.
- 24 (DEFENDANT'S EXHIBIT NUMBER THREE (3) is marked for
- identification purposes by this court reporter.)

- I Q. (BY MR. ATKINSON) Okay. I'll show you what has now been
- 2 marked Defendant's Exhibit Number Three, Ms. Efird, and
- 3 ask you if you can identify this. Is this a statement
- 4 that you made to Officer John Reid, Special Agent John
- 5 Reid of the State Bureau of Investigation back on July
- 6 21<sup>st</sup> of 1999?
- 7 A. Is that the statement that I gave?
- 8 Q. Yes, ma'am.
- 9 A. Yes, sir.
- 10 Q. Okay. Now, in that statement, did you indicate that
- II Allen yelled at her and told her to leave?
- 12 A. That's what was stated to me, and I did state back what
- was told to me, yes, sir.
- 14 Q. Okay. And in that statement, did Vanessa state to you
- she thought Chris had been shot in the chest?
- 16 A. If that's what I said. As far as I remember she said he
- 17 was shot from behind.
- 18 Q. Well, this is the statement you made, is it not?
- 19 A. Evidently so, it's wrote down.
- 20 Q. And that was on July the 21st of 1999, is that correct?
- 21 A. I guess, sir. That's been so long ago. I mean, you
- 22 know.
- 23 Q. Well, would the statement that you made on July  $21^{\rm st}$  of
- 24 1999, would it have been fresh in your memory then at
- 25 that time, would it not have been?

- 1 A. I'm sure it was a lot fresher than today, yes.
- 2 Q. Okay. Now, did she also tell you, Ms. Efird, that she
- 3 returned to the area approximately five to six hours
- 4 later to pick Scott Allen up?
- 5 A. Yes.
- 6 Q. And she indicated to you that she had gone somewhere to
- 7 pick Chris' truck up after the shooting occurred, is that
- 8 correct?
- 9 A. As far as I know, she said she went back to the truck.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. From what I gathered, the truck was there the whole time.
- 12 Q. Okay. Would you look at that and see, does that not say,
- Ms. Efird, that she returned to the area approximately
- 14 five to six hours later to pick Scott Allen up? She
- 15 stated, Vanessa indicated she had gone somewhere to pick
- up the truck?
- 17 A. Right. Somewhere which meaning that it was away from the
- 18 area that the boy had been shot.
- 19 Q. Now Ms. Efird, how long did she stay with you?
- 20 A. Her and Scott? A couple of weeks.
- 21 Q. No. I'm talking about on this occasion when she was
- 22 talking to you on that occasion. How long did she stay
- 23 at your house?
- 24 A. I really don't remember.
- 25 Q. You have no recollection whatsoever how long she was

- there?
- 2 A. That had to been that day, I'm -- Well, the best I
- 3 remember that I told her that she's lucky that Scott
- 4 didn't kill her, that I got paid on Thursday, and that I
- 5 would carry her to the beach, which is what I did. When
- I took her to the beach, that night, I got awakened about
- 7 somewhere during the middle of the night, somebody was
- 8 looking for a lighter, and they said Vanessa had got my
- 9 car keys to go get cigarettes. I looking in my pocket
- and my keys were gone, my money was gone, my car was
- 11 gone.
- 12 Q. So after you took her to the beach she stole your
- vehicle, didn't she?
- 14 A. And my money.
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 A. And my car.
- 17 Q. And you didn't lend that to her?
- 18 A. No.
- 19 Q. And you didn't lend your vehicle to her?
- 20 A. Nope.
- 21 O. And you didn't lend your money to her?
- 22 A. No.
- 23 Q. And that's the last time that you saw her, Ms. Efird?
- 24 A. Up until the time --
- 25 Q. When did you next see her?

- 1 A. It had been a long lapse up until the time I had went to
- 2 the courthouse in Troy. I went up there, and her mother
- 3 was up there for a visit. I visited her one time. The
- 4 next weekend I moved to the beach at Ocean Isle, which is
- I think around March 25<sup>th</sup> of 2000.
- 6 O. And this time, this, you're talking about, Ms. Efird,
- 7 about the other time that you went to a cabin with
- 8 Vanessa Smith and Scott Allen, that was a long time prior
- 9 to that, wasn't it?
- 10 A. It was some time prior. I wouldn't say very long. But
- it was prior to the incident.
- 12 O. Well, it was what, a month, two months, a year?
- 13 A. I would say it might have been within months, but not a
- 14 year, no.
- 15 Q. Okay. And at no time while, on this occasion on July the
- 16 12<sup>th</sup> when you were having this conversation with Vanessa,
- at no time was Scott Allen there at your house or as far
  - as you knew in the area?
  - 19 A. No, sir.
  - 20 Q. And you never saw this white vehicle at your house, did
  - 21 you?
  - 22 A. Yes, sir, I did.
  - 23 Q. Okay. And that was that occasion when you talked about?
  - 24 A. The same date that -- The same day I took him to
  - 25 Millingport.

- 1 O. Okay. That was --
- 2 A. It was around an hour that I had took him that they
- 3 showed back up at my house.
- 4 Q. But that was the month or some other time prior to that,
- when you're talking about seeing him, that other time
- 6 when you took him to Millingport?
- 7 A. The day I took him to Millingport is the day I met Chris,
- 8 and the only and other -- the only time I ever met and
- 9 saw Chris.
- 10 Q. But that was some time substantially prior to July 12th,
- Was it not?
- 12 A. Yes.
- MR. ATKINSON: I believe that's all the
- 14 questions I have, Your Honor.
- MS. ALLEN: Just a moment. May I approach the
- 16 witness, Your Honor?
- THE COURT: You may.
- MS. ALLEN: If I could have --
- 19 \*
- 20 \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*
- 21 REDIRECT EXAMINATION of MS. LILLY EFIRD by MS. ALLEN:
- 22 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) This is what has been called Defendant's
- 23 Exhibit Three which is the statement that you gave to Mr.
- 24 Reid, okay, that Mr. Atkinson was just talking about.
- 25 Could you read the statement beginning right here where

- I've marked it where it says "Vanessa -- " and ending
- 2 here at the end of the paragraph.
- MR. OLDHAM: Your Honor, we would object.
- 4 THE COURT: Well, sustained.
- 5 Q. (BY MS. ALLEN) Ms. Efird, have you had a chance to look
- 6 over that statement?
- 7 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 8 Q. Does that refresh your recollection as to anything else
- 9 that Ms. Smith told you about what happened in the woods?
- 10 A. Yes, ma'am.
- II Q. Is there anything else that she told you?
- 12 A. Not other than the fact that he asked her to leave and
- 13 then she came back later to pick him up.
- 14 O. Did she anything about whether Chris was still alive?
