8	Q. Good morning, Pete.
9	A. Good morning.
10	Q. The view from up there is a little bit different than

13	Q. Will you please state your full name for the record.
14	A. My full name is Chapin Pierre Oldham, O-L-D-H-A-M.
15	Q. Where do you live?
16	A. Asheboro.
17	Q. What is your profession?
18	A. I'm an attorney.
19	Q. For how long have you practiced law in Randolph
20	County?
21	A. I was licensed to practice in August of 1971. So that
22	would make it about 46-and-a-half years.
23	Q. And are you still in practice in Asheboro?
24	A. At least for a couple more months.
25	Q. Are you in a general practice or do you have a

specialty?

- A. General practice.
- Q. Have you in the past represented the defendant here today, Scott David Allen?
 - A. I have.
- Q. Would you tell the court what matters you have handled for Mr. Allen?
- A. The first time I saw Mr. Allen was in -- somewhere in the '90s. I think it was the mid '90s. I was appointed to represent him in some breaking and enterings, if I recall, of a church in Randolph County, and I was subsequently appointed to represent him, I guess, around 19 -- somewhere 1999 or 2000 in a first degree murder case involving the death of Christopher Gailey.
 - Q. Did you have co-counsel in that case?
 - A. In the murder case I did.
- Q. And who was that?
- 18 A. Will Atkinson.
 - Q. Do you recall who -- I want to go back to the earlier representations. Do you recall who accused Mr. Allen of involvement in the church break-ins?
 - A. As I recall, there was a few witnesses. One of them was a woman by the name of Vanessa Warner.
 - Q. And who was the prosecutor?

MR. VLAHOS: Objection. Irrelevant.

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MR. UNTI: Fine.

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THE COURT: Overruled. If he remembers.

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It was Mr. Yates' office, either himself or somebody else in

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that office who prosecuted the case at the time.

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Q. Do you recall who was involved from law enforcement in

I don't recall who was the specific DA in this case.

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A. I remember Barry Bunting was the investigating officer for the sheriff's department in Randolph County.

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Q. Did that case go to trial?

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A. Yes, it did.

A. I can only say that it was when you were investigating Mr. Allen, at some point you became aware that I had represented Denise St. Clair, RPR, CRR, CRC

him in an earlier stage. My office personnel pulled his file and that was in that particular file for that particular case.

MR. UNTI: Based on that, your Honor, I would move to have Defendant's Exhibit Number 5 admitted into evidence.

MR. VLAHOS: The State objects, your Honor, because it has not been authenticated properly at this time.

MR. UNTI: Well, I think, your Honor, that he's established that it is a business record that came out -- pardon me?

THE COURT: I said, yes. I thought that's where we were going. We know at least it came out of his file. I don't know what weight we should put on it, but we know at least it came from his file.

Let the record reflect that the court will admit

Defendant's 5 as a business record, as Oldham has identified

this document as being part of a file that he regularly kept in

evidence.)

Q.

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(By Mr. Unti): Was the Chris Gailey murder then the next time that you represented Scott Allen?

It was. Α.

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Do you recall who the district attorney was at that Q. time?

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I do not recall specifically who prosecuted the case. It's my recollection that Mr. Yates was in the courtroom with one or more of his assistants at that time.

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Do you know who was involved from law enforcement? Q.

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This was -- in the Gailey murder case, it was a Α. Montgomery County case, because I recall the body of Mr. Gailey

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had been found and there was some questions as to whether or not

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the body was found within the geographical boundaries of

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Montgomery or Randolph County, and I recall going to the scene,

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and I think it even got to the point where surveyor services

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were retained by the State of someone to determine if the body

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was located within the geographical boundaries of Montgomery

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County. I don't recall the specific officers down here in

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Montgomery County who were investigating the case.

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I can remember going to the sheriff's department, as was my custom, to review the physical evidence, and doing that, as I

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recall, on a Friday afternoon, but I can't recall what date that

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was.

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Did there ever come a time when you had any contact with or discussion with Lieutenant Barry Bunting about the

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outcome of the church break-in case?

- A. Well, I recall after the murder trial was over he saw me in the sheriff's department in Randolph County and he was rather upset because he blamed me for the subsequent homicide of Mr. Gailey because of my representation of Mr. Allen in the first case.
- Q. Focusing again now on the Chris Gailey murder case. What do you recall about the facts of that case?
- A. I recall that when I was initially appointed, I came to Montgomery County and saw Mr. Allen in the room to my right outside the courtroom here and we talked because it was always my practice to say, do not make any statements henceforth to anybody except to me about this particular case. And the next thing I remember about the case was trying to get discovery, and I think the very first thing I did, which was my practice in all the cases in which I represent somebody charged with murder, was to file motion to request funds for the services of Danny Carter, private investigator.
- Q. Do you recall who accused Mr. Allen of involvement in the shooting of Chris Gailey?
- A. The person who allegedly was with Mr. Allen at the time this particular instance was supposed to have occurred was Vanessa Smith, who was previously Vanessa Warner.
- Q. So it's the same woman who had previously accused him and then changed her story, according to your testimony?

That's correct.

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After receiving the discovery, did there come a time Q. when you and Mr. Atkinson decided upon a defense strategy in the murder case?

- Well, it appeared to me that, having seen Mrs. Warner's testimony previously that -- and she was supposedly the only person who was present other than my client when this incident was supposed to have occurred, that the case was going to turn upon her credibility.
- Do you recall whether she claimed to have been an Q. eyewitness to the shooting?
 - Α. She did.
 - Do you recall where that shooting allegedly happened? Q.
- As I indicated earlier, it was in the, as I recall, the northern part of this county in such close proximity there was a real question which county it occurred. I remember going to the scene. I remember Mr. Carter, which we always made that a practice of walking the scene, and I remember it was, as I recall, a cabin very far back near the national forest because we walked into that area and walked back out. And it was, I don't recall how long, but it was not a short distance.
- What was your overall strategy in the penalty phase of Q. the trial?
- Well, I don't -- I remember we had hired the services of a psychologist. I believe it was Gary Hoover, who was an Denise St. Clair, RPR, CRR, CRC Official Court Reporter

instructor at UNCG Greensboro. I did not recall that until you and the representative from the attorney general's office was asking me about it that Gary had died.

I remember going to Mr. Hoover's funeral with Mr. Megerian, who is another attorney in Asheboro, and with Danny Carter. It was in Greensboro. And so that would have been something we had done early on was hired his services. I don't recall specifically what he did or said after that.

- Q. Did you subsequently find somebody else to act as a consulting mental health expert?
- A. That is my recollection yes, that a different psychiatrist was supposed to be for him. I believe Gary Hoover might have been just a psychologist then. I'm not sure if the next guy -- I think he was a psychiatrist; either psychiatrist or psychologist, Dr. Warren.
 - Q. Dr. John Warren?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Did you at the time you were preparing for the case know anything about the relationship between Mr. Allen and Vanessa Warner Smith, what their relationship had been?
- A. I gathered at some point it had developed into something more than just acquaintances, because I recall that it seemed like at some subsequent point Mr. Allen was working on work release at Capel's Outlet, which is across the road from the courthouse here, and it seems like to me Mrs. Warner,

- 1 Mrs. Smith, whatever she was known at that time, had been the 2 person who had picked him up from that place and he did not 3 return.
 - Q. Do you recall whether they were boyfriend and girlfriend?
 - A. That was my impression that it developed into that at some point in time.
 - Q. Do you recall whether by the time of the trial whether they were still boyfriend and girlfriend?
 - A. I don't think so. At that time at the trial Mr. Allen had been arrested, I don't recall which date, but he was in the western part of the United States and he was brought back to this area and she was here at the time. At some point she was in the Montgomery County jail down here. I recall that.
 - Q. Do you know what prompted his arrest while he was out west?
 - A. I can't positively say. I don't remember specifics of that. I think it had something to do with statements. I know she at some point had told law enforcement officers that had more or less taken a position she was going to testify against Mr. Allen.
 - Q. She was going accuse him of shooting Chris Gailey; is that correct?
 - A. Yes. Because my recollection is these people were all friends, including Mr. Gailey, and at some point she accused Denise St. Clair, RPR, CRR, CRC

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Mr. Allen, and she was the primary witness against him.

- Q. Let me ask you this. Did your earlier experience with Vanessa Warner Smith in the church break-in case play a role in your decision to choose a defense strategy based on her credibility?
- A. I think my early experience would have told me to question her credibility, whether she was being truthful about everything.
- Q. Were you aware at that time whether or not Vanessa Warner Smith had a substance abuse problem?
- A. There was substance abuse throughout case, from what I remember, on her part, Mr. Gailey's part, just about everybody involved in the case.
- Q. Do you recall at any point in time seeking out medical and mental health records of Vanessa, Vanessa Warner Smith?

MR. VLAHOS: Objection, your Honor, to its relevance to the sentencing hearing.

MR. UNTI: Your Honor, I think, as we mentioned during the opening statement, based on the instructions that Judge Cromer gave to the jury, anything that goes to the circumstances of this crime and that would tend to mitigate the evidence against him or raise residual doubt is relevant in sentencing and is relevant in this hearing.

THE COURT: Okay. Well, we're not going back through medical records that we've already plowed through. I guess

1	there's additional questions that can be asked about her
2	substance abuse, and I think there were questions, as I recall,
3	to the evidence synopsis that I've read and the different
4	motions and different testimony, trial transcripts have been
5	presented to me, they were allowed to do some of that, but I'm
6	not going to try to steal anybody's thunder here. We're not
7	going to go back and retry issues that we've already decided
8	concerning the evidence that Judge Cromer would not allow to be
9	presented to the jury. But I'll let you go ahead and pursue it
10	thinking there might be other questions or other evidence that
11	might have been presented.
12	MR. UNTI: Your Honor, I do not intend to ask
13	Mr. Oldham to go through those records or testify to them.
14	Mr. Oldham has, in fact, never seen them, because they were not
15	turned over to him and to Mr. Atkinson at the trial.
16	THE COURT: That's my recollection as well. Thank
17	you.
18	I interrupted you or Mr. Vlahos correctly objected.
19	If you want to ask the last question again, I'll allow it.
20	(Previous question read back as follows:
21	"QUESTION: Do you recall at any point in time seeking
22	out medical and mental health records of Vanessa, Vanessa Warner
23	Smith?"
24	MR. VLAHOS: Objection to preserve, your Honor.
25	THE COURT: Let the record reflect the State continues Denise St. Clair, RPR, CRR, CRC

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to object. Objection overruled. Go ahead, please.

- My recollection is she did have a problem and we did file a request to have those records presented to us. There was an in-camera hearing conducted. The presiding judge advised us he did not feel like, after consulting with counsel that had been appointed to represent her, there would be anything of benefit to us for the trial of the case and we were not allowed to see it.
 - All right. Thank you Mr. Oldham. Q.

Did you consider calling a mental health professional as a defense witness during either phase of Mr. Allen's trial?

- As I recall, we had filed a request to have him examined by Gary Hoover. Subsequently someone replaced Mr. Hoover after Mr. Hoover's untimely death. My recollection was if we would have called him, it would have been during the penalty phase, if it got to be that far.
- Do you have any recollection of having made a strategic decision not to call a mental health professional during the penalty phase of the trial?
- I do not have any recollection of making a strategic decision at that point in time.
- Do you know why a mental health professional was not called?
- I can't tell you at this point who was called and who was not called at the penalty phase. So I don't remember any Denise St. Clair, RPR, CRR, CRC

1 strategic decision made not to call anyone.

- Q. Do you recall obtaining any mental health records from Mr. Allen's childhood and adolescence in the course of your investigation in the case?
- A. My recollection is at some point I had determined, and I don't know when this occurred, about him having been seen in Abemarle possibly, and I remember that was one of the things I think Detective Carter obtained for us. And I can't recall specifically, but it would be my practice to turn those over to the psychologist or psychiatrist who was examining him at that time.
- Q. In that case, that would be Dr. John Warren after Dr. Hoover's death?
- A. It might have been Dr. Hoover's initial and then Dr. Warren later on.
- Q. Do you recall -- other than listening to them this morning, do you recall a potential witness named Tina Fowler?
- A. I recall that at some point it came to my attention she could be a potential alibi witness, and I recall that Danny Carter and I got into a vehicle and rode out at the Denton area at one time looking for her. I don't recall seeing her on that occasion. I recall seeing a gentleman who was either her father or her grandfather and he -- we explained to him why we were looking for her and asked him to get back in touch with her.

My next recollection is at some point Mr. Carter may

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have located her at a later date, and at that point in my conversations with Mr. Atkinson, at some point there was a meeting arranged for him and her at the IHOP restaurant in Asheboro. And as I recall, Mr. Atkinson, although he did not remember her name, he finally said, I think that's the lady who worked out at the club where he was a member, and he suggested that since he had had some interaction with her it might be more appropriate if he goes to speak with her at IHOP, so I did not accompany him on that.

- Q. So it's your recollection that Tina Fowler Chamberlain was acquainted with Mr. Atkinson at some point?
- A. It was my recollection, yes, they were acquainted with each other. I'm not saying the -- I'm just thinking he remembered her working at the club where he was a member and suggested that because of that relationship he wanted to interview her.
- Q. Did you ever interview or contact a man named Joe Laughlin?
- A. I cannot recall that name. I do not know if I did or not. I don't recall specifically. And I remember Mrs. Fowler because I remember riding with Mr. Carter on that occasion.

 Some occasions I would go with him, on other occasions he would go on his own and he would come back and make reports to me.
- Q. So there were some people, as I understand your testimony, that Danny Carter would have interviewed and there

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would be no lawyer present?

- A. That would be correct. Yes.
- Q. Do you recall that Mr. Allen had a close friend and girlfriend named Kelly Racobs?
- A. What I recall is that she was possibly in whatever state he was located in subsequently. I don't recall much more about her specifically.
- Q. Do you know whether she came here for the trial of Mr. Allen in 2004?
 - A. I cannot recollect that.
 - Q. Do you recall interviewing her?
- A. I do not recollect that.
- Q. To the best of your knowledge, did you ask her to come to this area to be a witness in this case?
 - A. To the best of my knowledge, I do not recollect whether I did or not.
 - Q. I may be able to think of three or four other ways to ask that question, but I'll let them go then.
 - A. Okay.
 - Q. Do you recall the photographs or videos from ATM machines in this case?
 - A. I don't recall the specifics. I remember there was something allegedly taken. It might have been a card, a debit or credit card, taken from Mr. Gailey that was used at someplace. And it seems like, but I can't say for sure, I do

- not recall Mr. Allen being -- showing up in that.
 - Q. Do you recall other people showing up in those ATM photographs?
 - A. I could not tell you who they were at this point, but I just remember I didn't think it was our client.
 - Q. Did there come a time that you or Mr. Atkinson, to your knowledge, sat down with Mr. Allen and reviewed the ATM videos and photographs?
 - A. I don't recall the specifics about that particular facet of the case.
 - Q. Do you recall any efforts that Mr. Carter or you or Mr. Atkinson made to identify the people in those photographs?
 - A. Not now I do not.
 - Q. One further question on that. Do you have any recollection of a point in time when you and Mr. Atkinson were reviewing the tape and the tape appeared to be broken or damaged?
 - A. I don't have any recollection of that.

THE COURT: Is this a bank tape?

MR. UNTI: Yes. Bank ATM where Mr. Gailey's debit card was being used.

THE COURT: Thank you, sir.

MR. UNTI: Your Honor, I don't have any further questions for this witness at this time.

THE COURT: Thank you, sir. Yes, sir.

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Any redirect?

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MR. UNTI: Yes, sir.

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REDIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. UNTI:

4 5 Q. Mr. Oldham, did you file a motion for a continuance following the illness and subsequent death of Dr. Gary Hoover?

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A. I did not recall. It's like these documents, I could not -- they were in the file. I haven't seen many of these

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things in years.

- Q. And it was as a result of that that Lieutenant Bunting blamed you for Chris Gailey's death?
- A. I think he was -- this was a case, a church case, and there was lot of heat, I think, because for some such reason no offer was ever made and he felt like he came too easy on that case and he would not have been out otherwise.
 - Q. He, being Scott Allen, got out -- came out too easy --
 - A. That's what --
 - Q. -- following that case?
 - A. That's what he felt, yes.

MR. UNTI: Your Honor, that's all I have.

THE COURT: Thank you.

RECROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. VLAHOS:

- Q. You're not stating it's your belief that the prior breaking and entering case had anything to do with this capital murder case; is it?
 - A. No. I was simply stating that the prior case had
